- 17 THE COURT: I -- I -- I don't see how you get that
- 18 language to read what you're thinking. It says you are
- 19 required to move as far to the right as practical to allow traffic to pass you. 20
- THE DEFENDANT: Correct. And I -- I still believe, sir, 21
- 22 that I was far enough right to let traffic pass me. And --
- THE COURT: The question -- the statute says you have to 23
- 24 move as far to the right as practical. Your view is you are
- 25 over far enough. The fact that there's another cyclist beside

- 1 you tells you that there was a lot more room to the right that
- 2 would have been practical to move over had you not persisted
- 3 in going side-by-side down the road. So that's my view of it.
- 4 And that's how I read that statute. So I find the offense has
- 5 been committed. Do you wish to be heard on the issue of the
- 6 fine?
- THE DEFENDANT: No, sir. I -- I respect the judgment. 7
- THE COURT: Mr. Ray, do you need more than 30 days to pay
- the fine of \$151?


