Pursuant to the Appellate Rules (M.R. App. P. 7A(j)), I write to notify the Court of an important update on supplemental legal authority supplied by the Appellant in the above captioned matter.

On March 25, 2024, Appellant alerted this Court to a decision by the Supreme Court of Louisiana bearing on the constitutionality of a statute reviving previously expired claims for child sex abuse. See Bienvenu v. Defendant 1, 2023-01194 (La. 3/22/24), 382 So. 3d 38, reh'g granted, 2023-01194 (La. 5/10/24).

As the preceding citation signals, the Supreme Court of Louisiana recently granted an application for rehearing. *See Bienvenu v. Defendant 1*, 2023-01194 (La. 5/10/24), --- So.3d--- 2024 WL 2102626 (Mem) (attached herewith).

Otherwise, Appellee is opposed to the Appellant's numerous writings to the Court providing additional information because it amounts to a unilateral, *de facto* extension of briefing deadlines inconsistent with and violative of the Rules of Appellate Procedure.
