## ORDER REGARDING APPENDIX

Judy's Moody, LLC, et al.

Peter Masucci et al. have moved for a further enlargement of the page limit for the appendix and of the time to file the appendix. The motion indicates that all parties consent to the requested relief.

In order to avoid the expense and trouble of printing, binding, and delivering an appendix of almost 800 sheets of paper, and to avoid the trouble and expense to the Court of handling and shipping a large appendix, the Court will require that only the first volume be printed and that the entire appendix be provided electronically.

The request to enlarge the time for the appendix is unnecessary because the parties may agree, and have agreed, to file the appendix any time through the date that the appellees' briefs are filed. M.R. App. P. 8(b)(1).

The motion is GRANTED IN PART. It is ORDERED as follows:

- 1. The appendix may consist of up to 1700 pages.
- 2. Masucci et al. must file eight copies of a printed and bound first volume (up to the first 300 pages, printed on both sides of up to 150 sheets of paper).

The printed first volume must include a table of contents to the entire appendix.

3. Masucci et al. must also file the entire appendix (including the contents

of the printed first volume) as a single pdf file in a manner acceptable to the

Clerk of the Law Court. The pdf file must

a) Contain the cover and table of contents of the appendix;

b) Be searchable for text anywhere in the document; and

c) Contain bookmarks that allow a user to jump to the first page of

any document in the appendix. The bookmarks must be named

with the numbering and description of the document as listed in

the table of contents, as well as the page number on which the

document begins. For example, the document beginning at page

414 must have a bookmark named "22(b)(i) Defendant Judy

Moody, LLC's Rule 56(h)(3) Response to the Attorney General's

Opposing Statement of Material Facts and Reply to the Attorney

General's Statement of Additional Facts (Nos. 1-69) (June 23,

2023) (p. 414)."
